Option 1: Frontier / Wells Agriculture – Site Tour

Frontier Agriculture Ltd is the UK's largest crop production and grain marketing business. Frontier has a market share of 20% of the grain market, trades around 5 million tonnes of grain per annum. There will be an introduction to Wells Agriculture and what they do as a business / what the role of a merchant is in agriculture. A summary and tour of the infrastructure on site and what it does – barley plant, bean plant, grain drying, cleaning & storage.



Option 2: Hooks Dairy – Farm Walk



The Smith Family have been milking cows at Hooks Dairy for 67 years and selling milk direct to the public since 2018. They milk around 90 cows through their robotic milking parlour and have developed a small farm shop with a milk vending machine as part of their marketing and diversification strategy which makes the most of the farm's location on the urban fringe of Borrowash. They are part of the Golden Hooves co-operative which focuses on regeneration and have recently regenerated their fields with herbal leys.

Option 3: Home Farm – Farm Walk

Home Farm has been farmed by the Dore family since 1947. They buy in cattle and finish around 800 each year in their Approved Finishing Unit (AFU). Alongside the beef unit they farm 1100 acres of arable land. More recently they have installed a digester which is capable of producing 30kw/hour for around 20hours/day and is fed around 4tons per day of FYM. Some of the excess heat from it is used to dry logs. The processed manure is put back onto the land as an organic fertiliser.

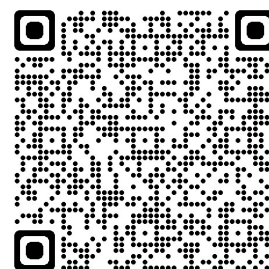
